# ABA endorses breast pump company LACEVO 's new wearable breast pump

The Australian Breastfeeding Association (ABA), Australia's leading authority on breastfeeding, is pleased to announce its first endorsement of a wearable breast pump, the LACEVO S70 In-Bra Wearable Breast Pump.

For over sixty years, ABA has provided practical mother-to-mother peer support and up to date and evidenced -based information to parents and families. LACEVO's hands-free, untethered, in-bra breast pump, is designed for busy mothers on the move and perfect for mums returning to work.

ABA conducted testing and evaluation, with the support of breastfeeding mums, producing the following results:

- All respondents liked the look and feel of the pump and found it easy to assemble and use.
- Suction and speed settings were all rated positively.
- Noise levels of the pump were described as 'moderate' or 'quiet' equally.
- The time taken for pumping was described as the same or slightly longer than with non-wearable pumps.
- Being able to go 'hands free' meant that respondents were able to complete other tasks, which was highly valued.

Historically, wearable breast pumps have presented challenges including weaker suction and shorter flange tunnels, limiting their usability for those who pump frequently or who have elastic nipple tissue.

'We have been impressed with the way LACEVO's Wearable Breast Pump is breaking down these barriers with its innovative design and thoughtful features,' said Ms Marshall-Cerins, ABA's Executive Officer. 'During ABA's testing of the product, it received positive reviews from breastfeeding mothers, across a range of categories, from function and performance, right through to user experience.'

The LACEVO S70 Wearable Breast Pump was designed by Sally Grice, an Australian breastfeeding mother of two, with nearly 20 years of product development and manufacturing experience who faced challenges with pumping while balancing both work and motherhood.

'Not only was I battling an over-supply while using pumps that were nowhere near efficient enough, but I also have elastic nipples so was dealing with painful engorgement due to inadequate milk removal, and the consequences of that on my mental health,' said Ms Grice. 'I desperately wanted to provide breastmilk for my baby, but I felt let down by what were supposed to be the best quality tools available, so I decided to make my own.'

## Supporting global recommendations and improving breastfeeding accessibility

ABA's endorsement of the LACEVO S70 Wearable Breast Pump, supports WHO and UNICEF guidance, which recommends exclusive breastfeeding for the first 6 months, and continued breastfeeding with complementary foods up to 2 years and beyond.



'We know that breastfeeding rates steadily decline as our babies grow,' said Ms Marshall-Cerins. 'In Australia 96% of women breastfeed when their babies are born, however less than 16% of babies are still exclusively breastfed at 5 months old.' (Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (2011).

While there are a range of reasons for this decrease, ABA recognises that many women find it challenging to balance the demands of breastfeeding and work. The availability of more convenient tools like the LACEVO S70 is a game changer for women wanting to combine work and breastfeeding. Access to tools like the LACEVO S70 reduces the need for women to compromise on their breastfeeding goals and may support mothers to provide breastmilk to their babies for longer than they may otherwise have been able to.
