



In 2024, the Department of Health, Disability and Ageing engaged Healthcare Management Advisors Pty Ltd to carry out an independent review of the Breastfeeding Helpline and related services.

The review examined how well the services meet their purpose, whether they can be sustained into the future, and how effective they are overall.

The review was released to the public in September 2025 and some highlights are shown here.
