By adding ABA to your resume and to your cover letter you are promoting ABA and the amazing skills you have learnt. Does this help when you have been out of the paid workforce and feel you haven't got those workskills that might be expected?

RE triggering negative emotions: I usually simply call ABA a 'health non-profit' in the covering letter, then name ABA/WBTi in the CV
